A Talk in the series of Lectures organized by the Berry & District Historical Society and given by John McQuilton.

PUBLIC LOOS AT MUSEUM - CRISIS AVERTED

Shoalhaven City Council has been asked to find locations for some additional public amenities. The Berry Museum was asked to consider whether public toilets could be located at either the rear of the building behind the laundry or at the back of the side garden area adjacent to the back of Sew and Tell.

Council very properly called a site meeting to consult Historical Society members in late September. We were able to put our views to Mr Brad Davis and other officers of Shoalhaven City Council including the Council's Heritage Adviser. We explained that the proposed locations would not be consistent with provisions in our Heritage Management Plan for the back garden and would destroy valuable work already undertaken to implement recommendations of the plan. We made the point that it would be aesthetically disastrous and that our use of the museum site to hold functions and museum visits would be undermined. In short all Historical Society members present were horrified at the prospect. It was also agreed that there were other practical reasons why the Museum site was not an appropriate location for public toilets because it is out of the way of most foot and vehicular traffic.

The Secretary of the Society also wrote to Mr Davis at his request putting our views. The matter was also raised at the last meeting of the Berry Forum where we were invited to speak and to again explain our objections. Councillors Guile and Wells were present at the meeting and assured the Forum meeting that no decisions would be taken this financial year and that it would be unwise for Council to decide on the matter until the road works are complete and their impact on traffic movement assessed. They did not favor Berry Museum as a site for public amenities.

BERRY FLOODBOAT

One of the Berry Museum's valued objects is the flood boat. The flood boat, called the Noah was one of two boats built after the floods of 1870. Each boat was kept on either side of the Shoalhaven to rescue people on farms along the Shoalhaven in times of flood.

The Museum earlier this year applied to Maritime Museums Australia for a grant to undertake conservation works in collaboration with the Berry Men's Shed. It is our understanding that Nowra Historical Society had also applied for assistance in conserving the sister ship. Our application was successful in so far as it enabled us to access some expert assistance from Maritime Museums Australia who did not give us funds but instead offered to provide us with the assistance of a curator to develop a conservation management plan for the vessel. The Maritime Museum's Selection Panel determined that a plan was necessary before funds could be provided.

The curator Mr David Payne visited the Museum on 4 October and examined the boat carefully to assess its significance. He will prepare the conservation management plan and also recommend that the Berry Flood Boat be listed on the Australian Register for Historic Vessels. David's initial advice was that very little needs to be done to the boat apart from cleaning it and performing some minor carpentry jobs. We will probably not need to apply for grant funds to meet the requirements of the plan. After we receive the curator's report and plan we will call for volunteers for a working bee to clean the vessel up.
